### APPROVAL OF MINUTES

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

#### **Director's Report/Performing Arts**

Kit reported.

- We had a couple of great performances this month. ScrapArtsMusic was very good.
   Unfortunately we had poor attendance. Russian National Ballet was excellent and very well received.
- This Friday we have *Kyle Eastwood*, the last of our Backstage Series. He will also do some school programs. On the 14<sup>th</sup> we have *Popovich Comedy Pet Theatre*. Ticket sales are going well for Popovich.
- Kit reported Emily is leaving for a full time job with benefits. Kit requested permission to fill her vacated position. <u>Gary Moeller</u> moved to allow Kit to fill the Visual Arts Coordinator position. <u>Mike Jones</u> seconded. Motion passed 9-0.
- Chalk Walk is the Saturday before property taxes are due. Mike Jones asked if we have arrangements for people to get to the courthouse to pay their taxes. People will be directed to the south entrance on Main Street and will be escorted in a golf cart to the courthouse if needed.

#### **Building and Structure Report**

Doreen reported.

- Ballet went well. Doreen had 15 volunteers, which she said was plenty. It worked out well.
- The speakers were hung for ScrapArtsMusic and that worked well.
- We have 4 community rentals in April in addition to our 2 performances.

### **Education Report**

- Sean Lavne will be here next week. Workshop with teachers at the Arts Center on Thursday and at 5<sup>th</sup> Street and 10<sup>th</sup> Street schools on Friday.

### **Visual Arts Report**

Emily reported.

- Emily thanked the board for their support while she's been here.
- Emily distributed the proposed Visual Arts gallery exhibits line-up for 2014. The glass artist chosen won't work in our gallery. Another artist will be asked to exhibit in that spot. The new artist makes dresses out of romance novels. There is a variety of mediums being used by the artists. Selena Vonderheide moved to accept the line-up of artists. Pat Thyen seconded. Motion passed 9-0.
- Kit added that Emily had 2 receptions in March, High Schools and Elementary Schools which were extremely well attended.
- Emily encouraged the board to check out the current exhibit. It was hung on Good Friday. It took all day. She invited the board to the FiRST THURSDAY reception on April 4th from 5 to 8 p.m.

## **Project Coordinator Report**

Kit reported for Corina, who was out sick.

- Work continues on Chalk Walk and birthday parties.
- Mike said 6 food vendors have committed to the Chalk Walk, but if anyone knows of a nonprofit who might be interested in participating to have them contact him.
- Laura Pommier is doing another 3D community art project for the Chalk Walk. It will be Monet's *Lily Pond.* It will be a good photo opportunity.

### **Old Business**

- Mike wanted the board to be aware of three options that he has heard regarding the Arts Center. They are: remodeling the current building, building a new building on the Country Club Property and possibly putting the Arts Center downtown in the old Jasper Cabinet Company building. Mike is not in favor of the Jasper Cabinet Company due to the possibility of flooding. Kit added that a musical performance space is a very specifically designed space and not just any space will do. The City owns the current Arts Center free and clear. If the building is sold, money could be used as down payment for a new building. The possibility of a shared space with the Library was mentioned as a way to be economical. Discussion followed.
