Jasper, Ind. (November 6, 2019)—Jasper Community Arts, as part of a collaboration with the Jasper Public Library and Dubois County Museum, is hosting a special program as part of the *Crossroads: Change in Rural America* initiative featuring five local events.

Food for Thought – There and Gone and Back Again is a conversation sparked by the creative and culinary arts. It will take place on Tuesday, November 12, 6:30 p.m. at the Parklands Pavilion, 800 W 15<sup>th</sup> St., Jasper, IN.
