# MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY OF THE CITY OF JASPER DECEMBER 8, 2020

The Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Jasper, Indiana, met in regular session on Tuesday, December 8, 2020, via a video meeting.

#### **CALL TO ORDER**

Presiding Officer Mayor Dean Vonderheide called the meeting to order at 8:00 a.m.

#### ROLL CALL

Clerk-Treasurer Allen Seifert called the roll:

Also present via video conference were Police Chief Nathan Schmitt, Street Commissioner Jeff Theising, City Engineer Chad Hurm, Fire Chief/Code Enforcement Officer Kenneth Hochgesang, Director of Community Development and Planning Darla Blazey, City Attorney Renee Kabrick, and Clerk-Treasurer Allen Seifert. Personnel/Safety/Loss Control Director Cale Knies was absent.

Clerk-Treasurer Allen Seifert announced that in order to have a quorum for the meeting, a majority of the board members must be present. Two of three board members were present, which is a majority; therefore, there was a quorum for the meeting.

**APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES.** The board members examined the minutes from the regular meeting and special meeting held on November 24. Thereafter, a motion was made by Nancy Eckerle and seconded by Mayor Dean Vonderheide to approve both sets of minutes. Motion carried 2-0.

**CLAIMS.** The claims against the City from November 6, 2020 to December 3, 2020 were presented to and examined by the board. Thereafter, a motion was made by Nancy Eckerle and seconded by Mayor Dean Vonderheide to approve the claims as presented. Motion carried 2-0.

### **DEDICATION OF RIGHT OF WAY**

Brad Eckerle of Brosmer Land Surveying requested a dedication of right of way at St. Charles St. and 13<sup>th</sup> St. for the land owners, Jenny Caldwell and Timothy Sanders. He advised they will be building a house at the location.

A motion was made by Mayor Dean Vonderheide and seconded by Nancy Eckerle to accept the dedication of right of way. Motion carried 2-0.

## PURCHASE A NEW DISPATCH CHAIR FOR THE POLICE DEPARTMENT

Police Chief Nathan Schmitt advised he received three quotes for the purchase of two Dispatch Chairs, model IRON HORSE 310S intensive use, for the Police Department.

## START HIRING PROCESS

Police Chief Nathan Schmitt advised Becky Schmitt has resigned her position as Chief Communications Officer and request permission to interview for the position. He advised the position will be filled internally. He also requested permission to start the hiring process for a new dispatcher.

A motion was made by Mayor Dean Vonderheide and seconded by Nancy Eckerle to allow Police Chief Schmitt to interview for the Chief Communications Officer position and to start the hiring process for a new dispatcher. Motion carried 2-0.

## **TOWING SERVICE PROPOSAL**

The City of Jasper sought a \$10 franchise fee per tow proposal for the removal, towing, and storage of vehicles resulting from police action and/or vehicle accidents on November 24, 2020.

## 34<sup>TH</sup> ST PROJECT FINAL CHANGE ORDER

City Engineer Chad Hurm requested the board to approve the final change order for the 34<sup>th</sup> St. project in the amount of \$8,335.44. He advised the change order was due to compacted aggregate, pipe, and soil issues.

A motion was made by Mayor Vonderheide and seconded by Nancy Eckerle to approve the final change order in the amount of \$8,335.44. Motion a 2-0.

## **ANNUAL SUPPLY BIDS FOR 2021**

The supply bids for 2021 were taken under advisement at the November 24, 2020 meeting. Street Commissioner Jeffrey Theising said the street department reviewed the bids for Items 1 thru 8 and made the following recommendations;

## TREE GRINDING QUOTES

At the November 24, 2020 meeting, the quote for the grinding of 7,095 cubic yards of trees/limbs/yard waste was taken under advisement.

Street Commissioner Jeffrey Theising recommended accepting the quote, with alternate, from Smith Creek, Inc. for \$19,528.00 where the contractor takes the material for \$25.00 per load plus \$1.95 per cubic yard for additional piles.

A motion was made by Mayor Dean Vonderheide and seconded by Nancy Eckerle to accept the quote from Smith Creek, Inc. for \$19,528.00 where the contractor takes the material for \$25.00 per load plus \$1.95 per cubic yard for additional piles, not to exceed \$21,000. Motion carried 2-0.
