# **Project Coordinator Report**

- Chalk Walk went well. Registrations were about the same as last year. Lots of people walking around looking at the artwork after the event ended. Stand-ins were very popular for photo ops. They were very well painted. Next year the Chalk Walk will be moved to June 6. Question was brought up about ending the event next year at 3 p.m. instead of 4 p.m. Crowd appears to thin and could be much warmer next year in June. Discussion followed. This issue will be revisited at a later date.
- Girl Scout art party was held in April for the girls to earn an art badge. This went very well. Other troops have shown an interest in doing the same.
- Special Events Committee has been working with the Strassenfest Committee on incorporating art into the Strassenfest. Chalk Walk Stand-ins will be used at the Strassenfest. ACT will offer a workshop during Strassenfest. Emily is coordinating a plein aire workshop for Strassenfest Saturday with a guest artist. The cost will be \$40 and the group will meet at Shelter House #4 on the Riverwalk. The Special Events committee will have a booth at the Strassenfest for attendees to make Bavarian hats out of paper with a feather or a flower. Volunteers are needed for this booth. Local art work will be displayed in store windows. And the JAC float this year will host the Hofmarschall, who is Tom Schum.
- The mural committee continues to meet and make progress on the mural. Elements of the design were presented to the board. The final design is not completed yet. Local artists were invited to offer ideas for the mural. The concept for the mural came from JHS student Allison Reckelhoff. The mural site is Krempp Lumber Company's east wall, across the stree from the Farmers' Market area. Muralist Cyd Smiley is assisting with the mural. This will be a onetime project because we will not become a mural business. The public will be invited to assist with the painting. Discussion followed.
